## Proven Record. Proven Results

### What Has Mayor Voller Done So Far?

#### Taxes and Revenue

- No property tax increases in Voller's 5.5 year tenure
- Tax base has grown over 60%
- Chaired county-wide referendum on the sale of mixed beverages which increases revenues for local businesses and the Town and County

#### Water and Sewer

Under Mayor Voller's leadership, Pittsboro obtained:

- ... a permit to begin its new wastewater treatment plant
- ... \$466,000 to refurbish the Credle St. sewer basin and \$182,500 to upgrade the municipal water treatment plant from the NC Rural Center
- ... \$750,000 from the Department of Commerce to replace the Hillsboro Street water main
- ... \$2.6 million federal stimulus grants for Pittsboro's aging waste water treatment plant
- Collaborated with Chatham County and regionally for a 21st century water treatment plant on Jordan Lake
- The Town of Pittsboro and Chatham Co. finished reuse water line to 3M

#### Transportation

- Collaborated on a Federal Transit Administration grant to fund the Pittsboro Express bus to UNC-Chapel Hill
- Obtained \$20,000 grant to develop a sidewalk/pedestrian plan which has been completed and approved
- Obtained \$243,000 of funding through Chatham County and NCDOT for sidewalks to CCCC

#### Public Safety

Under Mayor Voller's leadership, Pittsboro obtained:

- ... \$320,000 in grants for additional police officers, training, and equipment
- ... \$50,000 for police officer specializing in domestic violence

#### Recreation

Under Mayor Voller's leadership, Pittsboro obtained:

- ... 55-acre land donation from 3M to create Southern Park
- ... nearly \$1 million in grants to design and build:
  - 10-acre Mary Hayes Holmes Park, Powell Place
  - 55-acre Southern Park
  - Approx. 10,000 ft. of greenway trails in both parks and by Robeson Creek
- Refurbished tennis and basketball courts near Pittsboro Elementary School
