

TOWN OF PITTSBORO ADAPTS OPERATIONAL PROTOCOLS TO LIMIT FACE-TO-FACE CONTACTS

Effective March 18, 2020, the Town of Pittsboro will adapt its operational protocols to prevent the spread of the new coronavirus, or COVID-19. All Town government offices and departments will continue to operate serving the public; however, they will take proactive steps to limit face-to-face contact such as closing lobbies and reducing face-to-face meetings. These measures are in line with the guidance of federal government, Governor Roy Cooper's executive orders and state health officials.

Offices at Town Hall and the Planning Department will not be open to the public during regular operating hours except by appointment. The drive-up window at Town Hall will remain open for payments. All Town Offices will be accessible by phone and email during normal operating hours.

It should also be pointed out the April Planning Board meeting is canceled and that rentals at the Community House have been canceled.

Robert Morgan the Interim Town Manager stated: "These times are challenging, and the Town's goal is to serve and protect the citizens of Pittsboro."
